

Readers & Leaders Program

Trained volunteer high school students, with the direction of Foundation professionals and collaboration with libraries and schools, provide the sessions for children aged 3 - 6.

This **pre-literacy** program focuses upon early brain development/skills necessary for learning to read and write.

Programs include:

- Sound modulation
- Speech sounds perception
- Eye movements - Visual-linear formation of numbers and letters
- Tactile from recognition - Motor development
- Multisensory integration
- Multisensory memory and reading
- Multisensory rhyming and rhythm
- Multisensory sequencing
